All Angles and Curves

Starting next week, furniture by Oscar Niemeyer and Jorge Zalszupin, two of Brazil's most-celebrated architects, will be available in the United States, through Espasso, a design gallery in TriBeCa. The re-editions include items that Mr. Niemeyer, who died in 2012 at the age of 104, designed in the 1970s with his daughter Anna Maria Niemeyer, including the Rio rocking chaise (\$38,400), and Alta armchair and ottoman (\$28,450 for both). Espasso will also offer 20 pieces designed in the 1960s by the now-91-year-old Mr. Zalszupin, including his Circa bench (\$17,800) and delicately curving Brasiliana armchair (\$10,250). The pieces will be displayed at Espasso from May 14 to June 3, and will be for sale, then and after, along with a new monograph, "Jorge Zalszupin: Design Moderno" (\$80), by Maria Cecilia Loschiavo dos Santos.
