Featuring a walnut base, wrapped in three layers of foam and covered in a stippled chenille fabric, the high-armed and -backed chair is all style and comfort. But if you happen to disagree, Ballew and Draper will happily change the dimensions, type of wood or fabric.

Abode is filled with original creations ready to be customized. From Michael Ruh vases made to order in all shapes and colors to a one-of-a-kind Hugo Franca chaise lounge carved from a Brazilian tree trunk, the shop offers choices found nowhere else in Chicago. "We have exclusivity to most of our vendor lines," Ballew says. And if you want to transform your home from drab black and white into Technicolor, they'll customize a yellow leather chair to your liking.
